Provide simple revision techniques

Acknowledge the difficulties revision brings.

Fine-tune the strategy.

POTENTIAL FOLLOW-UP LESSONS:

- Fine-tune students' understanding of fragments versus complete thoughts/sentences.
- Identify a run-on and how to separate it with two *Spider-Leg* strips.
- Show students how to develop an idea further by adding information via *Spider Legs*.

Discussion: Turn & Talk

Assess students' current writing level and *if* they are ready for the *Spider-Legs* strategy.

- Are their pictures ready for more complete labels?
- Are their labels ready to be stretched into sentences?
- Are their ideas underdeveloped and in need of additional sentences?

Reflect on various revision techniques previously taught to students.

- How is the Spider-Legs strategy similar/different than others?
- Anticipate how students will respond to this particular strategy with its application of colored strips and tape.

Troubleshoot the logistics of this procedure.

- When will you introduce this lesson?
- What piece of writing will you direct students to pull out and apply Spider Legs to?
- How will you disseminate the tape and sentence strips?
- Could this become an independent revision activity in the future?
- How can this strategy be differentiated for students who lack fine motor skills needed for tape and scissors?
