### **Here's the assignment.**

Announce the task.

- Explain how this is a familiar skill but a slightly harder task.
- Outline the steps to execute the task.
- Point out any tech options or adaptations.
- Explain how to turn it in, if at all.
- Predict how long it should take them to complete.
