Infer AUTHOR PERSPECTIVE using F.A.S.T. Facts

INFORMATIONAL TEXTS



FEATURES

Text features highlight what is deemed important to the author.

TEXT FEATURES

- Title choice
- Subjects within visuals
- Style choices (e.g., underlined, bold, italicized, all caps, punctuation, etc.)

VISUALS

- Choice of angle or position
- Choice of font, type style, color, size
- Choice of sound, music, silence



The author delivers an account of the facts and evidence.

CONTENT

- Facts stated/
 Facts omitted
- Expert and eyewitness quotes
- Surprising and unexpected information

EXAMPLES

- What was/is done
- Steps or actions
- Specific stories, anecdotes, or experiences
- Hypothetical situations or *Imagine this...* scenarios



The author carefully considers *how* to reveal the information.

SENSE OF AUDIENCE

- Anticipates and answers
 questions/counterclaims
- Rhetorical questions

WORD CHOICE

- Detailed descriptions and figurative language to make a positive or negative impression
- Clever, witty, and/or playful language
- Words selected for connotation and shades of meaning
- Topic-specific vocabulary to confirm author as expert

STYLE

• Repetition to emphasize what's important



The author's personal beliefs are sprinkled in through opinions.

FEELINGS

- Attitude and emotion
- Preferences, struggles, and frustrations

GOALS & VALUES

- Reflections on what used to be
- Dreams about what could be
- Beliefs about what's important

PERSONAL OPINIONS

- Reasoning and explanations offered
- Criticism delivered subtly or obviously
- Praise expressed subtly or obviously
