After reading three articles about spiders, write an essay comparing the jumping spider and the long-bodied cellar spider. Consider their similarities and differences in body shape, web types, and habitat. Use information from all sources provided to write your informative essay.



Write an article that describes the features of a spider's web based on information you learned from the passages and illustrations. Explain what the web is for, what the web looks like, and where the web is located. Use information from all sources provided.



After reading several texts about spiders, write an opinion stating why spiders are or are not good for the environment. Provide reasons for your viewpoint. Use information from at least three of the sources to support your essay.



Using the facts and information provided from these texts, write a fictional story about a spider making a web. Use what you learned about the setting and the characters to describe a spider's problem and its solution.



After reading the three texts, explain the process spiders follow to make a web. Identify the sequence of steps from beginning to end. Use information from all sources provided to write your informative response.



Using the information learned from the four provided sources, compare the atmospheres of Earth and Venus. Include details from all texts that describe what both atmospheres are made of and what things are found within them.



After reading three texts and watching a video about the solar system, write an original narrative about life on another planet. Use the facts and information you learned about planets to describe a possible problem and how the character solves it.



Think about the illustrations from the different passages and how they help the reader learn more about the solar system. Write an article explaining what can be learned from the illustrations. Include details from all three of the four resources in your informational article.
