# **SAY WHAT** | 5 MINUTES

#### Introduce the reader's Reading Voice.

- · The speech bubble shape depicts it as a speaking voice.
- · It sees & says all the words, all the sentences, all the paragraphs.

### Everyone has a Reading Voice.

- · Hear the teacher's Reading Voice.
- · Hear your friend's Reading Voice.
- · Hear your own Reading Voice.





Some people have a **great sounding** Reading Voice (e.g., expression, fluency, character feelings, etc.). It's entertaining to listen to them read.

### Readers have multiple/different voices.

- · Show the signs.
- The *Thinking Voice* helps the reader figure out what the words mean.
- The **cloud-like bubble** depicts it as an **inside-the-head** voice.
- · It **whispers** quietly to the reader.

The *Thinking Voice* helps you "get" what the author is saying.


- · Can't just read each word out loud.
- · Readers think! You need both voices!
- · CAUTION: Fake reading.

#### Explain how to listen to both voices.

- · Show signs back to back.
- $\cdot$  The Reading Voice reads some words.
- · It stops for the *Thinking Voice* to say something about what the words mean. *I'm thinking...*
- · Show signs back to back.
- · Read a couple words, a sentence, or a couple sentences. What does this mean? What am I thinking about? [Step 2A ends]
