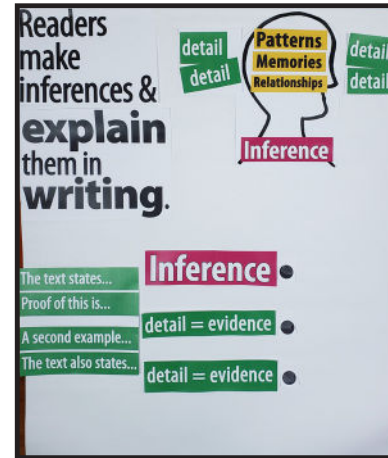
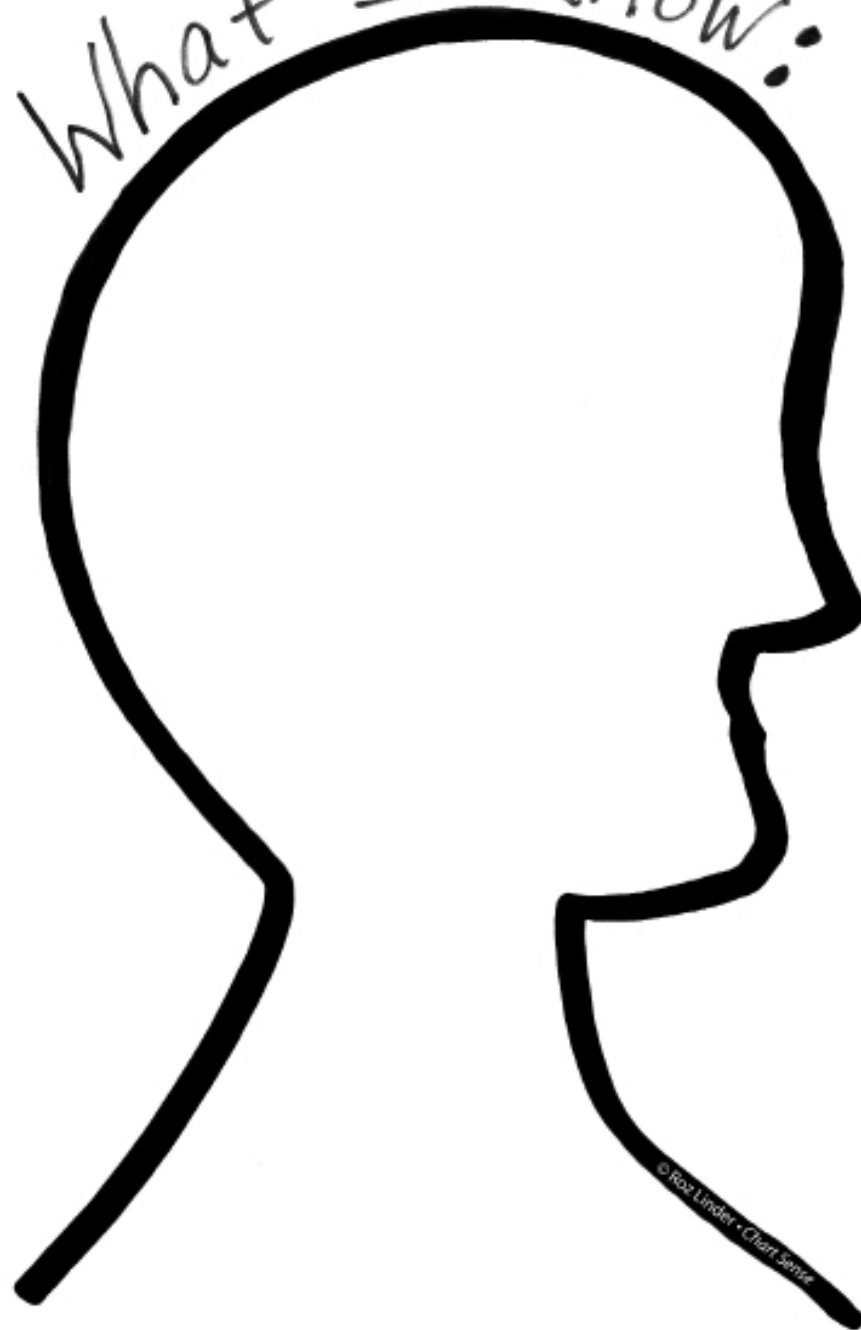


She opens a book and asks everyone to pay attention. Children sit all around her. When everyone is listening, she reads part of the book out loud. Then she asks several questions about what she read.

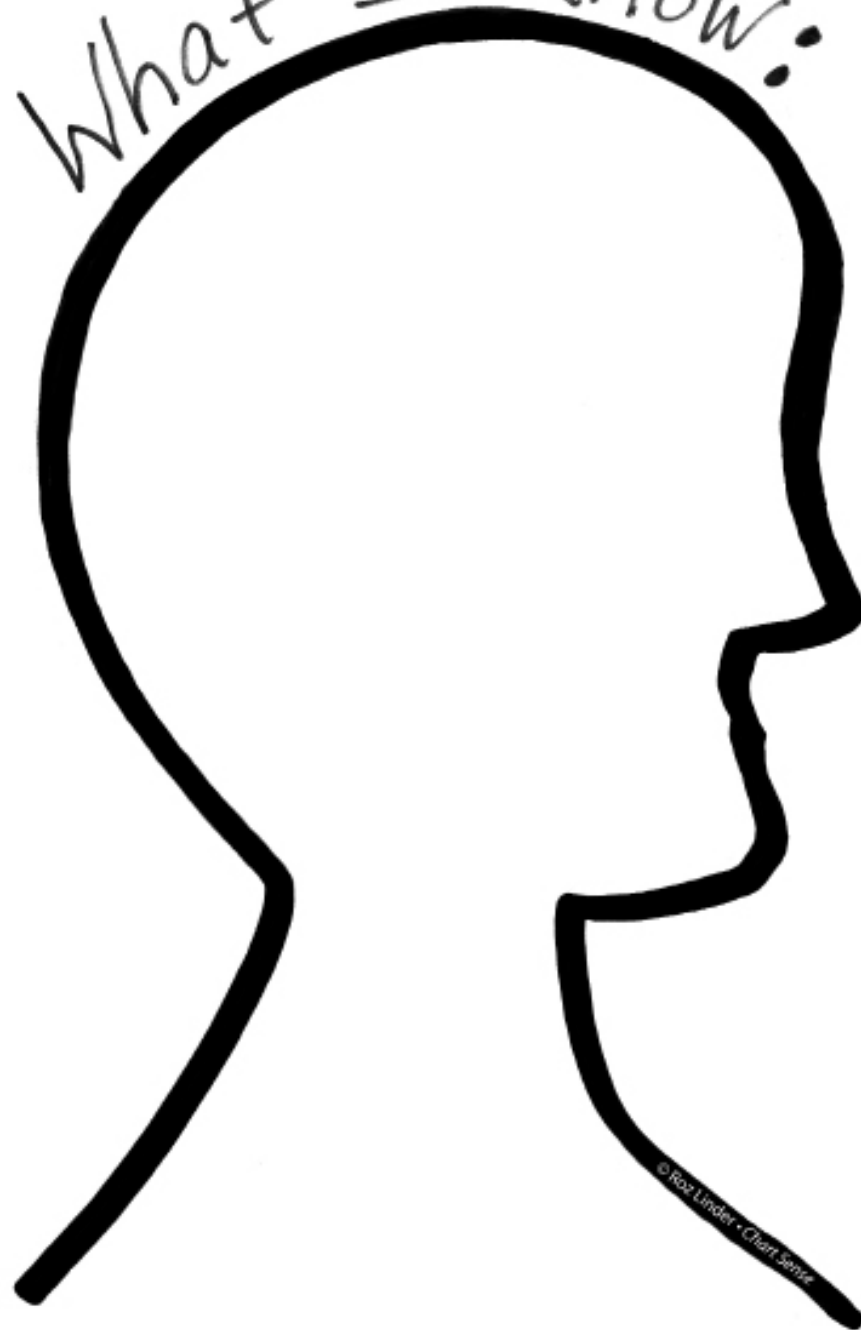
