

Topic A Eagle



- Represents strength and freedom
- Typically a 6+ foot wingspan
- Seeing UV light lets them see traces of prey
- National bird of USA
- 7000 interlocking feathers
- Large, hooked beak
- "Eagle eye" describes someone with good eyesight
- Females lay 1-4 eggs per breeding season
- Beak is heavier & longer than other birds
- Lines nest with soft materials
- See 4-5 times better than humans
- 4 talons/toes on each feet
- Over 60 species of eagles
- Powerful beak to grip & tear prey
- Recognized symbol of military
- 1 talon in back is longer than 3 in front
- Sees colors more vividly than humans
- Builds nest at top of tree
- Razor sharp talons
- Bald eagles aren't actually bald
- Feathers layered for warm in cold & rain
- Small eyes
- Sees ultraviolet light

Topic B Owl



- 9200 feathers
- Represents wisdom
- Get moisture from prey; rarely drink water
- Map adopt an abandoned nest
- Super hearing
- Character that gives advice
- Velvety thick & soft feathers
- Feathers absorb sound
- Rotate neck 270 degrees
- Broad wings allow them to float without flapping
- Typically a 4 foot wingspan
- Better depth perception than humans
- Eyes are not "balls" but tube-shaped
- Represents problem solving and strategy
- Builds nest in cavity of tree, building, cliff
- Powerful beak to grip & tear prey
- Owls have been known to attack joggers
- Great vision in low light
- Ears are not symmetrical; helps with hearing
- Eyes are completely immobile
- Lethal talons (3 in front, 1 in back)

<p>Eagle</p> 		<p>Owl</p> 
<p>hunt = "catch" "fights" "rips" > aggressive</p> <p>Hunts prey</p> <p>hunts during day</p> <p>catches, fights + kills prey</p> <p>huntress</p> <p>rips flesh off prey with beak</p>	<p>Hunts prey</p>	<p>Nighttime hunters "silent" = quiet "undetected" = stealth</p> <p>"lord of the night"</p> <p>Silent predators</p> <p>flies inches from prey - undetected</p> <p>powerful beak to grip + tear prey</p> <p>Sharp talons pierce prey's organs</p>
<p>flies in diff ways -soars high / "glides" -swoops fast</p> <p>max speed 100 mph</p> <p>long glides; soars gracefully</p> <p>flies +10,000 feet altitude</p> <p>normal speed 40 mph</p> <p>Solitary creature</p> <p>Swoops for prey</p>	<p>flight behavior</p>	<p>slower lower not far not fast</p> <p>doesn't fly far</p> <p>flies below 500 feet</p> <p>Swoops after prey</p> <p>fly alone</p> <p>40 mph max speed</p>
